
Where and How

over Highway No. II or a
pleasant two-hour train journey,
via Canadian Pacific Railway, there

Built of natural pine logs, the Inn nestles in the beautiful valley of Ste. Marguerite in the heart of the Blue Laurentians, the oldest mountain ranges of the globe. The deep rustic brown of the logs, blends perfectly with the green pine and spruce forests and the silvery trunks of mountain birch that form a frame of natural beauty and marvelous charm. A covered verandah invites you to rest and enjoy the vista of gay flower beds and velvety green lawns that sweep down to the edge of rippling water that is cool and refreshing.





What To Do

F you are fond of outdoor sports and recreations, here you will find them all in a setting that is unique and forceful in its appeal. A private sporty golf course, cut out of a forest of pine, spruce and balsam that calls for long forceful drives and short tricky shots—a splendid hard surfaced tennis court.... mounts from the Inn's stables to take you over wooded bridle paths.... nearby lakes and streams for the ardent fisherman... a sandy bathing beach where you emerge with a glorious sun-tan and where a thrilling water chute and water wheel furnish no end of fun... woodland walks through bits of dusky virgin forest. In the evenings, bridge... ping-pong... dancing to the strains of the Inn orchestra, or badminton played in the main lounge.

And there is the club lounge in the main building where you can enjoy club privileges in refreshments, or the popular log-walled tavern, where Goodfellows Get Together. The club house on the golf course furnishes the popular nineteenth hole.
